Clergy members and other ministry leaders are often expected to not only make all of the right decisions, but also have all of the answers. They are faced with ethical determinations in their personal lives every day, as we all are as humans. The decisions made in those ordinary moments can have long-term positive or negative consequences.

As a person charged with leading a church, a clergy member makes decisions at a far-reaching level. Ethical leaders can propel a congregation forward to do its best work. Unethical behavior, on the other hand, can erode the fabric of an entire congregation.

As clergy members are tested every day with situations that may challenge their own ethics and values, they must draw from a code of behavior. They must be ready to face life's everyday predicaments, grounded in the mission given to them by their congregation and the community they serve.
