What Is The "Call" To Ministry as A Licensed Local Pastor?

"Call" is God's invitation to use God-given gifts and talents to minister in the local church. For some, the call comes early; for others, it comes later in life and maybe even as a second career. Answering the call and living the vocation of a Licensed Local Pastor mirrors the call to Christian discipleship in the world.

If God is calling you to become a pastor, but you do not see seminary as a reality for you, then you may want to consider becoming a Local Pastor.

Local pastors are not ordained, but are licensed to preach and conduct worship and perform the duties of a pastor.

Local Pastors are appointed, but need not make themselves available as itinerant ministers.

What is a Licensed Local Pastor?

A Local Pastor answers God's call to serve the mission of Jesus Christ through serving a local congregation in The United Methodist Church. 2016 BOD ¶316.1

The Local Pastor <u>is not ordained</u> and serves under the authority of a <u>license for pastoral ministry</u> after completing the steps outlined in ¶310 of the 2016 Book of Discipline and meeting any Annual Conference requirements (see below).

The authority of the license is limited: 2016 BOD ¶316

1. Authority of the license extends only within the regular pastoral appointment or extension ministry made by the Bishop. Such authority is during the time of the appointment and does not extend within any other charge or setting.

2. Authority is under specific and direct supervision of the District Superintendent and the mentor.

3. Authority is subject to annual renewal by the District Committee on Ordained Ministry and Conference Board of Ordained Ministry.

When first licensed, one's local church membership will be transferred to the Annual Conference. 2016 BOD ¶316.6

When appointed, the Local Pastor performs the usual duties of a pastor, including

- preaching and teaching;
- leading in worship and liturgy;
- receiving new members;

• performing the Sacraments of Baptism and Holy Communion;

• and performing the services of marriage (where state laws allow),

- burial,
- and confirmation.

Licensed Local Pastors may also be appointed to an extension setting if approved by the Board of Ordained Ministry and the Bishop.

What Do Licensed Local Pastors Do? 2016 BOD ¶316.1; ¶340

The Licensed Local Pastor is Licensed to Order the Life of the Congregation(s).

The Licensed Local Pastor oversees:

- the total ministry of the congregation,
- its nurturing ministries,
- and its mission of witness and service in the world.

The Licensed Local Pastor is to have administrative oversight of the charge and to supervise the working program and outreach of the congregation(s) to which the Licensed Local Pastor is appointed.

The Licensed Local Pastor gives pastoral support, guidance, and training to the lay leadership and helps them fulfill the ministry to which they are called.

The Licensed Local Pastor is to provide ministry within the charge and to the world by using the process of goal setting and planning through which the laity take responsibility for ministry in the name of Jesus Christ.

Challenges Facing Local Pastors in the UMC

GBHEM

Licensed Local Pastors are a necessary part of the itinerant structure of The United Methodist Church.

• When there is a shortage of seminary graduates available for appointment to churches, Local Pastors are asked to step in and fill the void.

• When churches can no longer provide the salary package and benefits required for full-time, itinerant, ordained ministry, Local Pastors are appointed to meet the needs of these congregations.

• Since 1990, the number of part-time and full-time Local Pastors has grown in The United Methodist Church to meet these and other needs for pastoral leadership. Today more than one-third of United Methodist churches are served by Local Pastors and associate members, rather than seminary graduates or elders in full connection with the Annual Conference.

The use of Local Pastors presents some significant challenges to The United Methodist Church. Since Local Pastors are licensed and not ordained, that means more than one-third of our churches do not have ordained pastoral leadership. The challenge is to provide adequately trained pastoral leadership to a significant percentage of United Methodist churches. In some Annual Conferences, there now are more clergy members of the Annual Conference who are Local Pastors than there are ordained elders in full connection. This has meant a significant shift in the nature of the Annual Conference itself. *https://www.gbhem.org/clergy/local-pastors/faq*

• Local pastors may vote on all matters presented to the Annual Conference, <u>except constitutional amendments</u> and matters of ordination, character, and conference relations of clergy. Local pastors who have completed the educational requirements and served under appointment for two full conference years immediately prior to voting, may vote on delegates to General and Jurisdictional Conference.

• <u>Full-time and Part-time Local Pastors may serve on</u> any board, commission, or committee with voice and vote, except on matters of clergy character, qualifications, status, and ordination. Local pastors who have completed the Course of Study may serve on the District Committee on Ordained Ministry with voice and vote. Local pastors who have completed the Course of Study may serve on the Board of Ordained Ministry with voice and vote. ^{2016 BOD} ¶^{318.5}

 Local pastors who have completed the Course of <u>Study may upon retirement annually request from the District</u> <u>Committee on Ordained Ministry and the Bishop a license to</u> <u>continue to serve in the local church where they hold</u> <u>membership for the purpose of providing sacramental rites of</u> <u>Baptism and Holy Communion, at the request of the</u> <u>appointed pastor.</u> ^{2016 BOD} ¶316.8 ¶320.5

Categories of Local Pastors

Full-time Local Pastors: Pastors who devote their entire time to the church they are appointed. They must complete four courses per year in a Course of Study school or be enrolled as a theological student in University Senate approved college, seminary, or school of theology. ^{2016 BOD ¶318.1}

Part-Time Local Pastors: Pastors who do not devote their entire time to the church they are appointed. They must complete two courses per year in a Course of Study school or be enrolled as a theological student in University Senate

approved college, seminary, or school of theology. 2016 BOD 1318.2

Students appointed as Local Pastors: Students enrolled as theological students in college, university, or school of theology listed by the University Senate may be appointed as full-time-or part-time Local Pastors. ^{2016 BOD} ¶^{318.3}

What are Specific Local Pastor Relationships?

Bishop—the Bishop of the Conference will issue the license for pastoral ministry once all requirements have been met and the appointment where one is to serve has been set.

District Superintendent—the District Superintendent will have supervision over the process of educational requirements and the appointment of the Licensed Local Pastor within the District.

Local Pastor Registrar—this person is a member of the Conference Board of Ordained Ministry and works directly with Licensed Local Pastors.

Conference Board of Ordained Ministry—a group within the Conference where the Licensed Local Pastor serves which guides in educational formation, conducts an annual review, and makes recommendations about continuing as a Licensed Local Pastor.

District Committee on Ordained Ministry—a group within the District where the Licensed Local Pastor serves which guides in educational formation, conducts an annual review, and makes recommendations about continuing as a Licensed Local Pastor.

Clergy Mentor--an Elder or Deacon asked by the Candidate to assist them in all areas of preliminary candidacy for becoming a Local Pastor.

Candidacy Mentor—an Elder or Deacon assigned to assist the Licensed Local Pastor in all areas of ministry while in the Course of Study.

Fellowship of Local Pastors and Associate Members—an organization within the Annual Conference and within the national UMC to offer support for its members while in ministry in The United Methodist Church.

Inquiring Candidate: 2016 BOD ¶310-311

1. Must have graduated from an accredited high school or have received a certificate of equivalency before becoming a certified candidate. ¶310.1e

2. Shall be a Professing Member in good standing of the United Methodist Church or baptized participant of a recognized United Methodist campus ministry or other United Methodist ministry setting for one (1) year. ¶310.1a

Steps into Ministry as a Local Pastor: 2016 BOD ¶310.1

3. Spend time in prayer and discernment, listening for God's call in your life.

4. Talk with and work with a Clergy Mentor, such as your pastor, District Superintendent, or other deacon or elder.



5

Read resources such as "The

Christian as Minister" and "Understanding God's Call: A Ministry Inquiry Process".

6. Apply in writing to the District Superintendent, including $\P310.1b$

- your "statement of call"
- requesting admission to candidacy process
- and requesting the assignment of a candidacy

mentor.

7. Complete beginning stages of candidacy with candidacy mentor.

8. Write your "statement of call". ¶310.1d

9. Request a meeting with your church's staff/parish relations committee and be interviewed in light of Wesley's historic questions. ¶310.1d

• Do you know God as pardoning God? Have you the love of God abiding in you? Do you desire nothing but God? Are you holy in all manner of conversation?

• Have you gifts, as well as evidence of God's grace, for the work? Have you a clear, sound understanding; a right judgment in the things of God; a just conception of salvation by faith? Do you speak justly, readily, clearly?

• Have you fruit? Have any been truly convinced of sin and converted to God, and are believers edified by their service?

10. Meet with church charge conference for recommendation of approval of candidacy. A two-thirds majority vote of the members present is required for certification.

Certification as a Local Pastor: 2016 BOD ¶310.2

11. Request to meet with District Committee on Ordained Ministry and provide requested written information. ¶310.2a

13. Provide the Annual Conference with a satisfactory certificate of good health and other evaluations as required by the Annual Conference.

12. Provide other information as the District Committee on Ordained Ministry may require. ¶310.2c

13. Agree to highest ideals of Christian life as set forth in ¶¶103-105; ¶¶160-166 ¶310.2d

14. Meet with your District Committee on Ordained Ministry for examination and approval for certification and to obtain their recommendation for further studies. A threefourths majority vote of the committee members present is required for certification.

14. Complete the studies for the Local Pastor, including the Annual Conference's Licensing School and the Course of Study.

15.Be approved by the clergy session of Annual Conference.

Continuing Candidacy: 2016 BOD ¶319

1. Continue candidacy program with candidacy mentor and continue academic requirements

2. Annual interview and approval by District Committee on Ordained Ministry.

3. Annual report of satisfactory progress of studies and copy of transcripts from university or school of theology

What Is the Theological Educational Process?

The Licensed Local Pastor must pursue theological education through an approved seminary or in the Course of Study.

The Course of Study is a basic theological education program prescribed by the Book of Discipline and offered by the General Board of Higher Education and Ministry (GBHEM), the Division of Ordained Ministry (DOM). Course of Study includes Licensing School and Course of Study School.

What Is Licensing School?

Licensed Local Pastor Schools are offered by Annual Conference Boards of Ordained Ministry.

The guidelines suggest a minimum total of 80 hours of study in four practical areas:

- 1. Worship and Preaching,
- 2. Church Administration,
- 3. Christian Education,
- 4. Pastoral Care.

The length of the licensing school will vary. They may be arranged in any variety of configurations such as:

• a two-week residential school;

• or one week of instruction followed by a gap of several months in which continued study and reflection take place;

• or a series of four or five weekends.

Students who have completed one quarter of the work required for the M.Div. degree may be approved for license as a Licensed Local Pastor without completing the licensing studies provided through the Annual Conference.

What is Basic Course of Study?

Following Licensing School, Basic Course of Study is a five-year curriculum with four courses each year.

The Basic Five-Year Course of Study is a year-round experiential and classroom learning process. This process assumes cooperation between the instructors in the Course of Study Schools and the clergy mentors in the Annual Conferences.

Each Regional Course of Study School shall offer all 20 courses of the Basic Five-Year COS and shall seek to meet the needs of both the full-time and part-time Licensed Local Pastors. Normally courses are to be taken in the sequence prescribed by the curriculum. At a minimum, students are expected to take first year courses in the first year of study and fifth year courses in the final year of study. In addition to these basic curriculum courses, the school may provide a communication skills program for students. Other special programs may be funded at the discretion of the schools or the Division of Ordained Ministry and other programs that meet student needs.

Course of Study Basic Five-Year Curriculum

A full-time Licensed Local Pastor shall complete the Basic Course of Study within 8 years of when they were licensed.

A part-time Licensed Local Pastor shall complete the Basic Course of Study within 12 years of when they were licensed.

Who Are the Faculty?

Faculty should be a mix of persons with experience and expertise in the practice of ministry:

- prayer and worship
- preaching
- parish administration
- education
- pastoral care
- special ministries
- counseling
- chaplaincy
- Christian Education

The faculty of the school can be as few or as many as the coordinating director and the Board of Ordained Ministry feel are desirable.

The important fact is that faculty be practitioners of the art of ministry who are sharing their skills with new candidates.

Faculty should reflect diversity in gender, culture, tradition, and ethnicity. This diversity should be considered an instructional method.

In each case, the school should have a Coordinating Director whose responsibility is to secure the location, instructors, materials, and oversee the registration of students. It will be important to make sure that registration for the school is tied into the work of the District Committee on Ordained Ministry, superintendents, registrars, and others who are regularly involved in record keeping.

Where Can I Take Course of Study?

The following factors should be considered when choosing a location:

- geographical consideration
- cost
- meals
- chapel
- recreational facilities
- classroom size
- study rooms
- comfort
- housing
- accessibility
- access to medical assistance

The Basic Course of Study courses are offered through the Course of Study schools located in several regions in the United States.

A candidate who cannot attend a school in one conference may be commended to a school which is authorized by another Annual Conference, whose faculty would then make a recommendation to the candidate's District committee.

Effective June 1, 2019, Course 121 (Bible 1: Introduction) and Course 122 (Theological Heritage 1: Introduction) will be prerequisites for enrollment in any other Course of Study courses.

• Regional Course of Study Schools: Regional Course of Study Schools are established by the Division of Ordained Ministry at locations central to the student populations, taking into consideration such factors as availability of United Methodist theological school faculty, library resources, dormitory space, the density of student populations, etc. <u>Full-time Licensed Local Pastors shall attend one of the approved Regional Course of Study Schools each summer on the campuses of eight United Methodist seminaries.</u> <u>Most courses are offered in a two-week module that allows both full-time and part-time Licensed Local Pastors to attend.</u>

• Extension Schools: <u>Many of the regional schools</u> <u>have extension centers for Part-time Licensed Local Pastors</u> <u>only</u>. These extension centers usually offer courses in a twoor three-weekend format, which allows bi-vocational Licensed Local Pastors to participate without taking extensive time away from their work or families.

• **On-Line Correspondence Classes:** Many of the Basic Course of Study classes are available by correspondence and internet online formats through the Division of Ordained Ministry. By Discipline, no more than one-half of the classes may be taken in this format. ¶324.6c


