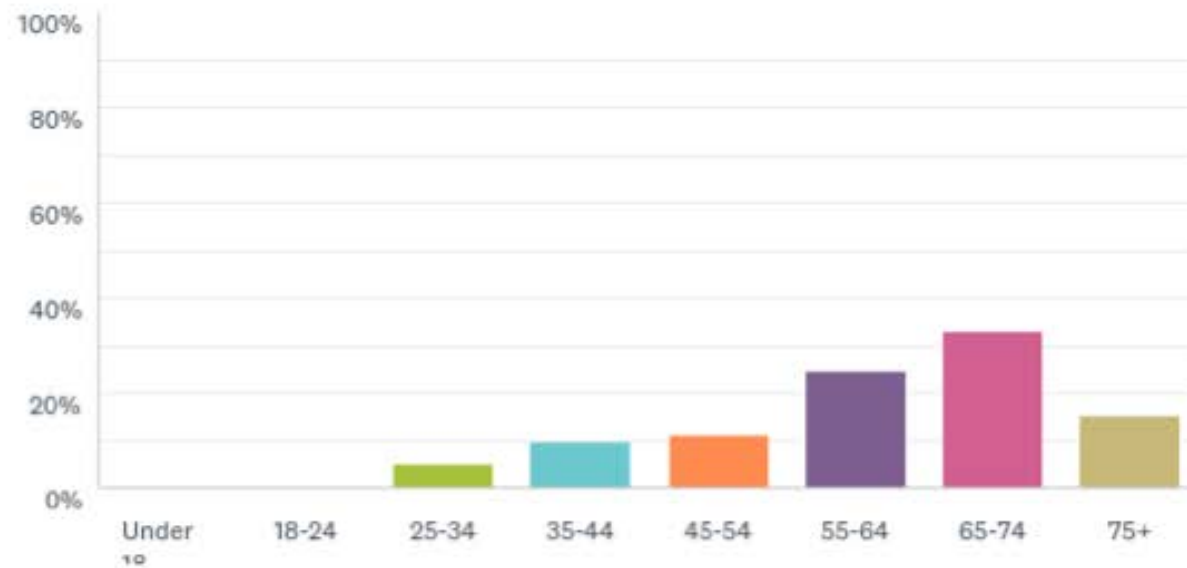

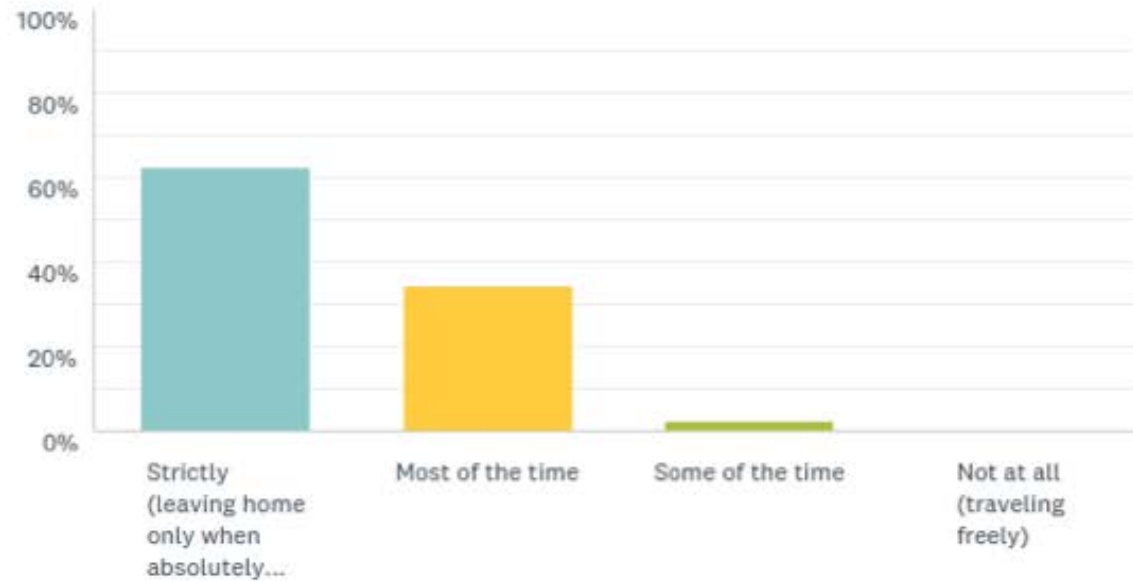
Q4: What is your age?

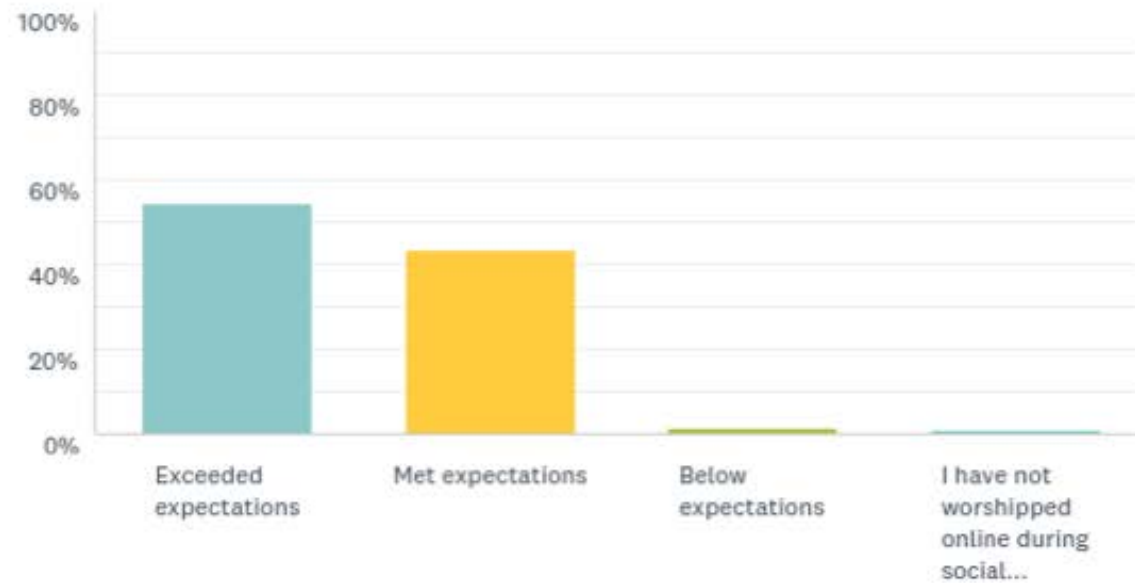
Q5: How strictly have you complied with the "Stay-At-Home" orders?

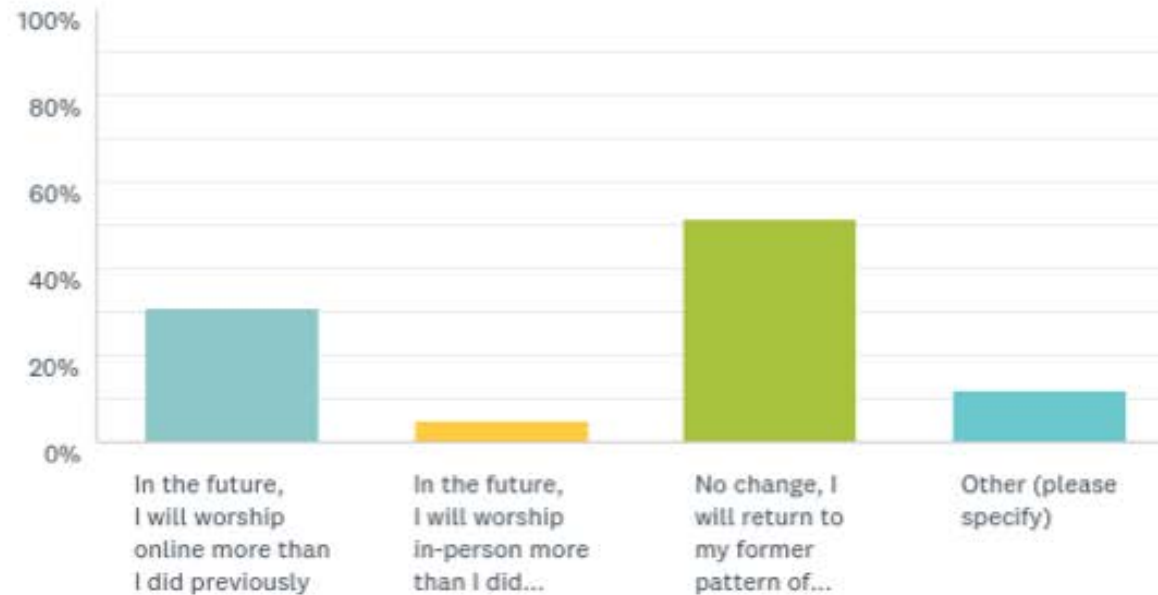
Q6: If you have worshipped online in the past seven weeks, what has been your experience?

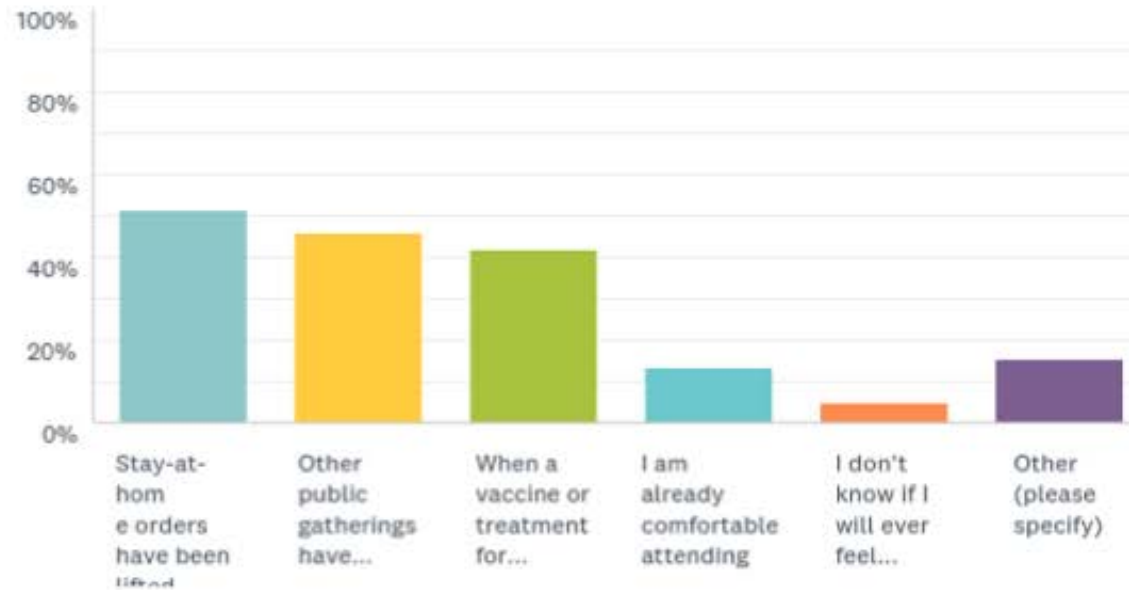
Q9: After this time of social-distancing and online worship, what do you think will be the change to your pattern of worship?

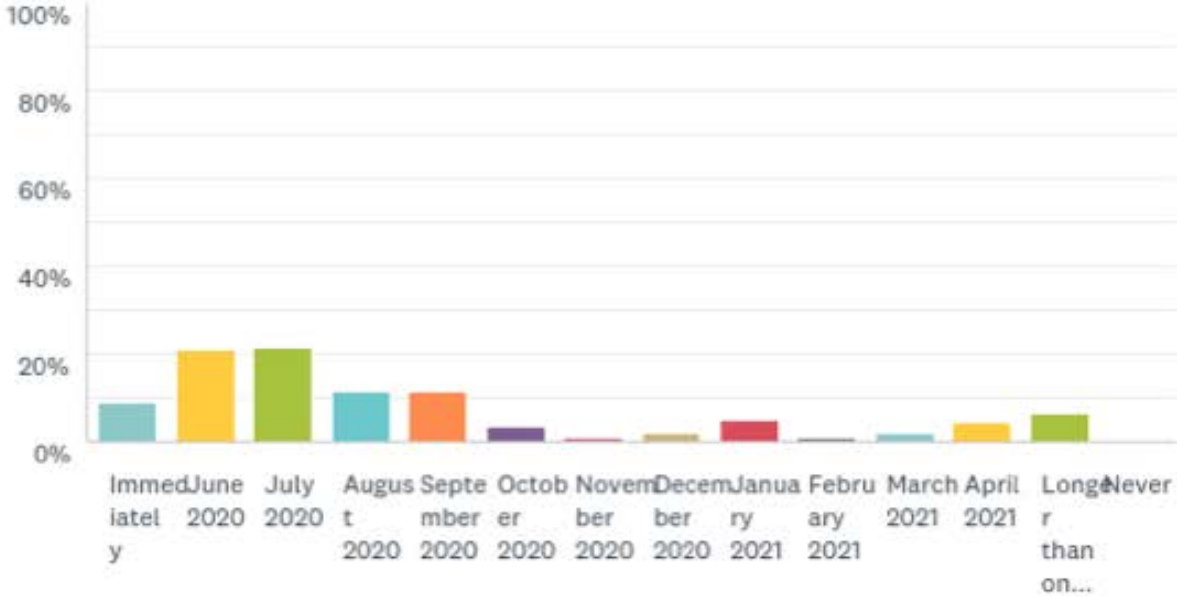

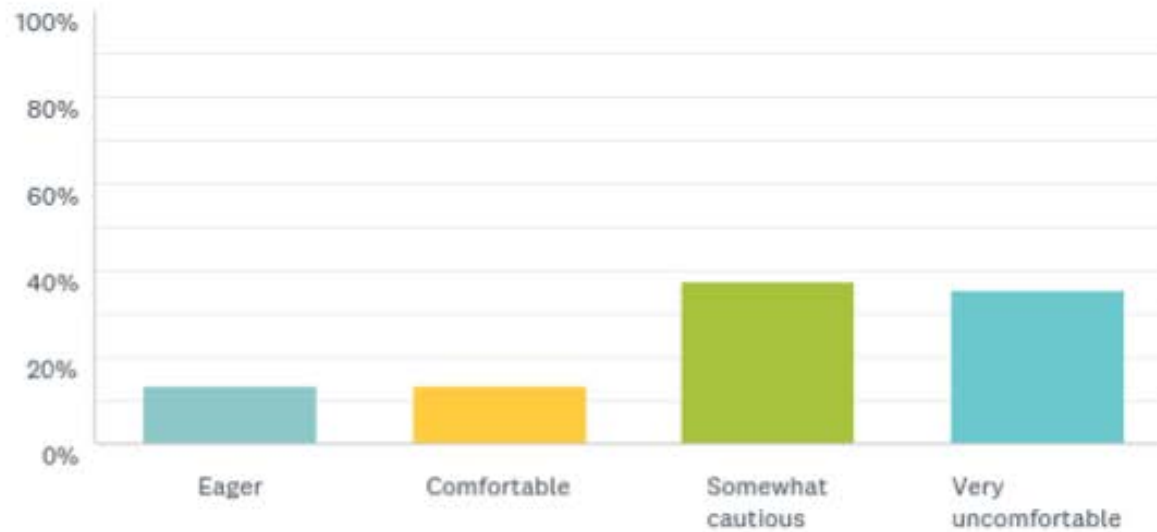

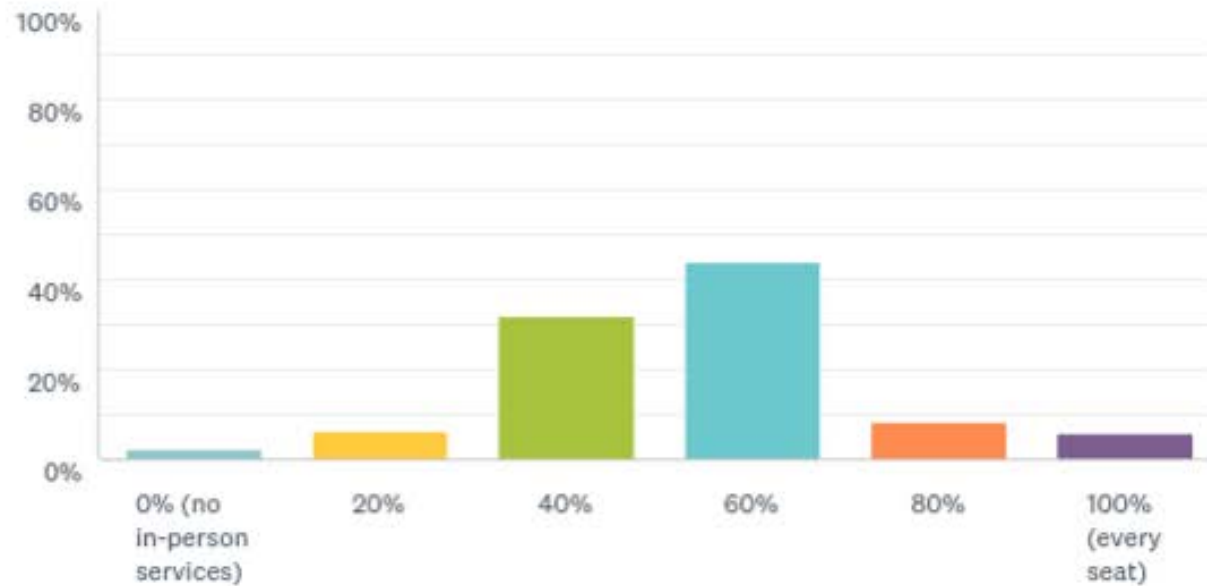

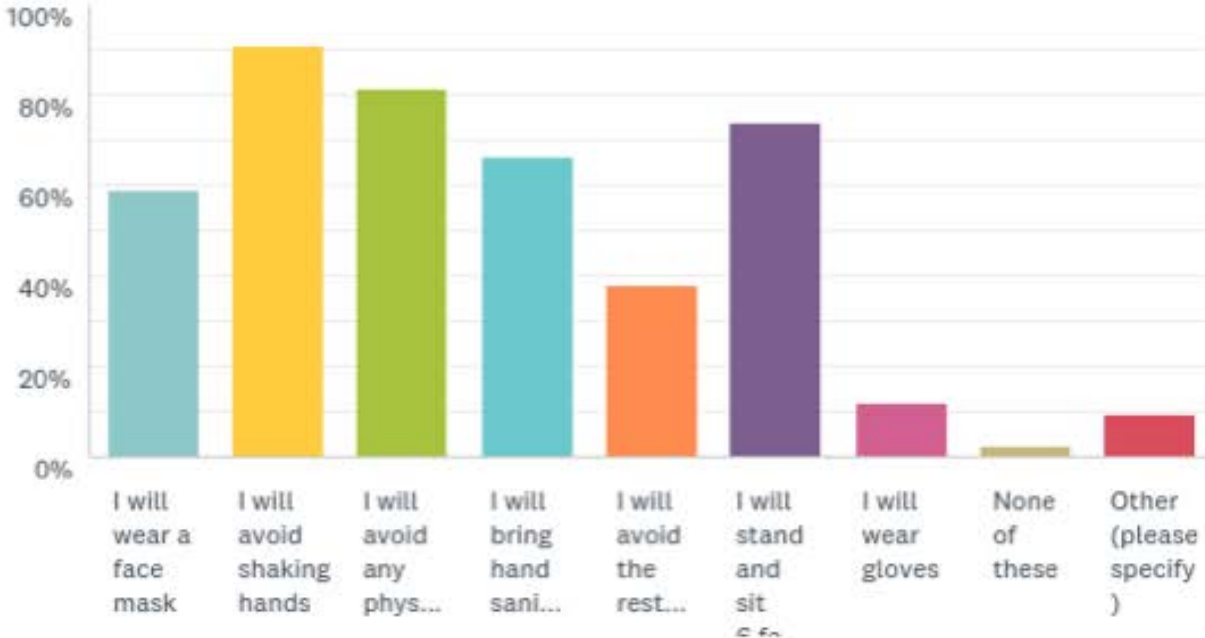
Q14: When we return to in-person worship services, what is the maximum attendance level at which you would feel comfortable?

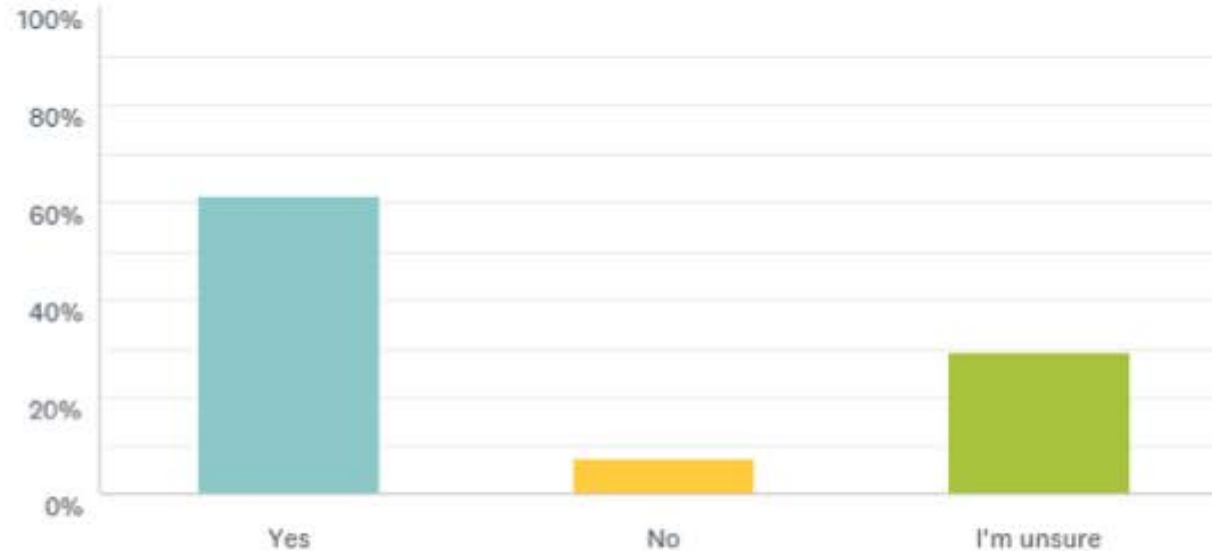
Q15: What precautions will you personally take when returning to worship
